

MSNBC Deadline: [NAACP President Urges Senators to Protect Voting Rights](#)

NAACP President Derrick Johnson met virtually with a group of Senate Democrats who the organization believes have not done enough to fight and protect voting rights. “We cannot allow 2021 to end without voting rights protections. It would be unconscionable... Our crippling democracy is not waiting around for the Senate to act,” Johnson said.

NAACP President Derrick Johnson says he plans to step up pressure on senators and the White House to take action on voting rights legislation, which would likely warrant changes to the legislative filibuster due to opposition from Republicans. “My message is simply that we’ve got to act to step up to protect democracy. Particular rules should not prevent the adoption of public policy to ensure the voting rights protections for Americans,” Johnson said ahead of his meeting with senators.

As hundreds of bills are being proposed by Republican legislators across the country ahead of next year's 2022 midterm elections, civil rights leaders have been tightening their grip on the White House and Hill lawmakers, particularly around 13 U.S. senators who had not yet indicated their full support of eliminating or amending the filibuster in order to pass legislation to protect voting rights for Black and minority voters, according to a Senate report card conducted by the NAACP.
